Prof. Dr. Douglas Bernstein

Biographical information on Prof. Dr. Douglas Bernstein:

Douglas Bernstein received his bachelor's degree in psychology at the University of Pittsburgh in 1964 and his masters and Ph.D. in clinical psychology at Northwestern University in 1966 and 1968, respectively. At the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign he taught graduate and undergraduate classes ranging from 15 to 750. He was Visiting Professor and Education Advisor to the School of Psychology at Southampton University and to the l'Institut du Psychologie at the University of Paris. He is currently Professor Emeritus at Illinois and Courtesy Professor of Psychology at the University of South Florida.

He founded the APS Preconference Institute on the Teaching of Psychology in 1994, as well as the APS Preconference Institute on the Teaching of Psychological Science at the biennial APS International Convention of Psychological Science. He has written or co-authored chapters and books on the teaching of psychology, as well as a compendium of classroom examples for psychology courses, a manual on progressive relaxation training, and textbooks on introductory, clinical, and abnormal psychology, and on criminal behavior. As a hobby he collects student excuses.
